Head Coach Rob Barr

Rob Barr is in his second season as the head men's and women's tennis coach. In 2011-12, Barr led the Hamilton women to seven dual match wins, which was the team's highest total since 2005-06. Four of his student-athletes made the 2012 NESCAC Spring All-Academic Team.

Barr was the interim head men's tennis coach at Middlebury College in 2010-11. He guided Middlebury to a dual match record of 18-4, including 6-1 in the NESCAC. The Panthers were semifinalists in the 2011 NESCAC

Championship, and went on to win two matches in the NCAA Division III championship before they fell to Emory University in the guarterfinals.

Barr coached the 2011 NESCAC Player of the Year and three all-conference selections. Two of his players earned All-America honors in 2011. Barr was an assistant coach at Middlebury in 2010 when the men captured the NCAA title, and he coached the ITA championship doubles duo of Andrew Thomson and Andrew Lee.

Barr has extensive experience at the Division I level, as he coached at four different institutions before Middlebury. Barr served as the men's assistant at Rice University and the University of New Orleans, and was the head coach at Southeastern Louisiana University and the University of Louisiana-Monroe.

Barr has coached a number of professional tennis players, including Thailand Davis Cup members Danai Udomchoke, Sonchat and Sonchai Ratiwatana. He has coached players at Wimbledon, the U.S. Open and Australian Open, as well as tour events around the world.

Barr earned his bachelor's degree and played collegiate tennis at Southern Arkansas University. He led the team to a top 10 Division II ranking in 1984. He continues to play competitively at the sectional and national level.

Assistant Coach Jeff Lonczak

Jeff Lonczak is in his first season as an assistant coach. Lonczak has been teaching and coaching tennis for 14 years in the Syracuse area. He helped coach the Onondaga Community College (OCC) men's tennis team to a 2008 NJCAA title. Lonczak, who became a certified tennis teaching professional in 2012, is the head tennis pro at the Manlius YMCA.

Lonczak won an NJCAA doubles title with Djanny Arnautovic while attending OCC in 1998. He captured a singles crown the following year. Lonczak was a three-time All-American at OCC, and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame with its inaugural class in 2004.

Lonczak went on to compete at Le Moyne College, where he was second team all-conference in the Northeast-10 Conference for doubles and third team all-conference for singles. He was ranked No. 9 in the Northeast Region for all NCAA Division II tennis players.

Lonczak continued to play tennis at the open level after college, and was ranked in the top 30 in the Eastern section. He is a member of the Syracuse men's 5.0 team and plays national open and prize money events



About the NESCAC

Founded in 1971, the New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) is a group of eleven highly selective liberal arts colleges and universities that share a similar philosophy for intercollegiate athletics. The Conference was created out of a concern for the direction of intercollegiate athletic programs, and remains committed to keeping a proper perspective on the role of sport in higher education.

The formation of NESCAC originated with an agreement among Amherst College, Bowdoin College, Wesleyan University and Williams College first drafted in 1955. Along with these four institutions, Bates College, Colby College, Hamilton College, Middlebury College, Trinity College and Tufts University are sustaining charter members. Connecticut College joined in 1982, bringing the Conference's membership to its current total of 11 institutions.

NESCAC members believe intercollegiate athletic programs should operate in harmony with the educational mission of each institution. The Conference is committed to establishing common boundaries to keep athletics strong but in proportion to the overall academic mission of the member institutions. In pursuit of this mission, the Presidents of each NESCAC institution control intercollegiate athletic policy. Conference tenets are usually more restrictive than those of the NCAA Division III with regard to season length, number of contests and post-season competition.

NESCAC institutions also believe athletic teams should be representative of the entire student body. Thus, admissions and financial policies are consistent with the NCAA Division III policies that prohibit athletic scholarships and award financial aid solely on the basis of need.

In 1999, the NESCAC formally became a playing conference and now sponsors 26 conference championship sports (13 for men and 13 for women). Member schools offer extensive and broad based intercollegiate as well as club and intramural opportunities for both men and women. With member institutions sponsoring an average of nearly 30 varsity programs, NESCAC provides more than 7,500 opportunities for participation in intercollegiate competition at the Division III level. Teams and individuals have achieved great success on both a regional and national level. During the 2011-12 academic year, 55 teams participated in NCAA team championships. NESCAC student-athletes claimed 21 individual national championships and NESCAC teams won three national team championships. The NESCAC has produced eight NCAA Division III women's tennis team champions, six runners-up, four singles champions and six doubles champions. Five NESCAC programs made the NCAA championship last year.
